

Footpath Volunteer Group

To receive funding (via a grant application) from the Parish Council, the group will need to open a bank account in their name and preferably have a constitution as well as other policies that adhere to a grant application being approved.

However, as the group has not been formed yet, other than a bank account being a necessity the other requirements may become available in due course.

They would use the Thorner Facebook pages to promote the work of the group and to seek volunteers to assist.

They are seeking permission for the Thorner Parish Council Facebook page to also advertise this.

They would be responsible for seeking authority from Leeds City Council and from the relevant landowners to carry out any work.

The Parish Council has in previous years acquired tools and equipment which might be used in the maintenance of the footpath network, which are currently stored in the substation. They would need access to these tools and equipment (some of which belong to Leeds City Council) as well as other Parish Council assets e.g. bollards - to protect work areas, high-viz jackets - when working on or close to the highway, litter pickers - in the event that they resurrect the village tidy up.

They are seeking an initial grant to the group of £1,500 to cover the cost of insurance and appointment of contractors.

The work required of the Group is weather dependent. We shall need to carry out the work that is required, when it is required.

The Group might be willing to take over responsibility for the maintenance of all the footpaths in the village, including those currently included in the Grounds Maintenance Schedule subject to funding being allocated to do so.

They are willing to negotiate the terms of the PPP grant to include additional paths, to do so they would need the Parish Council to agree to delegating its responsibilities under the P3 Agreement to the group.

They would be expecting invoices to be made payable to the Parish Council and be paid by the Parish Council.
