Dear Parish Councillors,

I think you may be interested in the following discussion about on-street charging solutions for EV's, where owners do not have access to private driveways or garage parking. I hope you may be able to add this topic to a **future Agenda for your PC meetings**, and I would be happy to attend and support discussion.

The implication will be obvious for EV owners parking on both sides of Thorner Main Street and in other areas of the village. As you may know, around the UK it has become popular to enable lampposts to offer EV charging at curb-sides, but of course in our dark village without any lampposts, this is not a viable solution for Thorner.

I was inspired to send you these details following a recent article (30-July-25) in a weekly online EV magazine (The Fast Charge) to which I subscribe.

Background: The £25m gully scheme - known officially in Whitehall as the 'EV Pavement Channels Grant' - was annouced by the government more than two weeks ago. At the time, it was branded 'pioneering' by DfT. In a press release, the Transport Secretary, Heidi Alexander, commented, "We are making it easier and cheaper to own an electric vehicle. We know access to charging is a barrier for people thinking of making the switch, so we are tackling that head on so that everyone - whether or not they have a driveway - can access the benefits of going electric."

The article refers to "gully systems" under the pavement and between slabs, whereby charging cables from the house [charging unit] to the car can be safely placed to avoid pedestrian trip hazards, as in the photo below:

There are many other pictures in the articles which follow, showing quite smart gullies with safety covers (please browse the articles).

The innovative cross-pavement technology will allow cables to run safely beneath pavements, connecting homes directly to parked vehicles, enabling more families to tap into cheaper domestic electricity rates for as little as 2 pence per mile even if they don't have a driveway.

The following article is a Government website where they are announcing £25M funding for gullies as part of £63M funding to boost EV uptake nationally:

I think LCC will be on the receiving end of some of this funding, and given our village predicament, Thorner could make a very good case for early consideration (perhaps even becoming a pilot study locally for this futuristic technology). We should not just stand by doing nothing and being eclipsed by other early adopters.

London Councils are advanced on these ideas (having already got the lamppost conversions underway), and here's a link to their publication on the subject:

Within the above article is reference to a large (37 pages) PDF document, which I attach in this eMail for your subsequent reference.

I hope I have wetted your appetite to think about, and possibly develop, these ideas as a potential solution for existing and future EV drivers in Thorner, who could be currently frustrated by the inability to charge an EV close to their homes. You will be aware of at least one EV owner in Thorner who has already flouted the rules about loose cross-pavement charging cables, and the gully solution could have avoided that problem.

Information footpath 18 - Resident enquiry.

There are two public footpaths through Saw Wood.

The first is the Leeds Country Way, which runs along Ellerker Lane, through the wood, emerging by the red bus Café.

The second footpath is less well used and passes through the wood, emerging opposite Flying Horse Farm.

Last year sight lines from where the path exited the wood, were virtually non-existent.

Leeds CC Highways were reluctant to take any action because there had not been enough serious accidents at the location, but due to pressure exerted Highways did attend and cut back some of the trees which improved the situation.

The Notice has the approval of Leeds Public Rights of Way but don't want it to be authorised by them in case it be seen that they are discouraging use of a public footpath.

The agents for Mexborough Estate, Strutt and Parker, have also approved the notice but don't want it to be authorised by them.

The resident has stated that Leeds PROW say they would have no objection to the Parish Council putting up this notice in the name of the Parish Council.

Another alternative would be to put it up without any representation.

THORNER FOOTPATH 18

This footpath emerges from Saw Wood onto the A64 York Road, opposite the Flying Horse Farm Development.

Walkers should be aware that visibility from where the path exits the Wood is limited in both directions.

A safer crossing is to take the Leeds Country Way - Thorner BW 17 (on the far side of the Wood), which exits onto the A64 near the Red Bus Café. Sight lines at this crossing point are much better.
